DFM Board Meeting Thursday, August 30th 7:30 PM Via Zoom

Those Present: Tyler Hoyt (President); Sheila Pane (Vice President); Dave Root (Member at Large); Morgan Di Santo (Secretary); Jordan Meyers (Treasurer); Melanie Gonzales (Market Manager).

- I. Meeting called to order at 7:34pm.
- II. Welcome Dave Root to the Board
- III. Booth Fees for Holiday Market
 - A. Discussed raising fees for November, December, and/or both markets to cover the cost of the December holiday market.
 - 1. County just started charging DFM for fairground space.
 - a) Free in past years.
 - b) Now it costs just under 1000\$ without kitchen space.
 - c) Can fit in about 50 to 55 ten foot booth spaces.
 - (1) If we kept the booth fee forty dollars for a ten foot space, it would theoretically cover the cost of space (be about \$2000) but would maybe eat into the budget.
 - (a) Would be a financial wash if kept the same price.
 - (b) In 2021: forty-three vendors at November Thanksgiving market and about fifty vendors at December Holiday market.
 - (c) At the end of 2021 there was a ton of unaccounted for money that Lyndee thought most likely came from holiday markets.
 - (d) For this year (2022), we wrote in \$50 into budget for both November and December.
 - (e) Sheila brings up: should we give farmer's a break?

- (i) Both extremely lucrative markets for farmers
- (ii) Does ten additional dollars make a difference?
- (f) Tyler in favor of doing fifty dollar booth fees for all vendors for both holiday markets.
 - (i) Dave, Jordan, and Morgan are also in agreement.
- 2. Tyler makes a **motion** to **raise** the booth fee **ten** additional dollars for **both** November and December holiday markets.
 - a) Board approves the motion.
- IV. Manager salary and job description
 - A. Job description
 - 1. Shelia updated job description and Melanie wrote text for the newspaper.
 - 2. We would like to advertise the position in the newspaper, online, and on online hiring platforms.
 - a) We would like to have a wider regional reach. Very unique job and not many people in Durango have done it.
 - b) Need to get it posted within the next week. Board members need to have approved job description and newspaper text by Friday September 10th.
 - B. Salary
 - 1. Tyler suggests salary range.
 - 2. Salary needs to be raised regardless; Melanie getting paid too little.
 - 3. Melanie's salary is \$595 dollars a pay period for twelve months.
 - 4. Tyler asks her what she thinks she is worth?
 - a) Average salary in La Plata county is \$56,000.
 - b) Melanie thinks range of twenty to twenty-five thousand per year would be fair.
 - (1) Could cover this by raising booth fees
 - (a) DFM board has not raised booth fees in over ten years.
 - (2) Market assistants will still be necessary.
 - (3) Is this job realistically part time?
 - (a) Quality may suffer for 25 hour week
 - c) At this point in the season, the budget is in the black a little over six thousand not nine thousand (which is what the budget says). Budgeted thirty thousand for booth fees.

- d) What would booth fees need to be raised to?
 - (1) Twenty-five additional dollars for 11 weeks.
 - (a) Or we could charge for more weeks.
 - (b) Prepay discount?
 - (c) Whether we up the booth fee or extend the payment period, the additional cost should be totally doable for most vendors.
- e) Manager job is big enough that we should pay more.
 - (1) Always can offer bonus at the end of the year if there is extra cash.
- f) Budget typically comes in five thousand dollars in the black.
 - (1) This year we have 102 vendors because we have bigger footprint (additional rows; closer spacing not that covid protocols loosened).
 - (a) Bigger the venue, more vendors we have, the more customers we can get
- 5. Sheila makes a **motion** to increase the market manager salary and that we offer a range of twenty to twenty-five thousand dollars.

a) All board members approve the motion.

- V. Towing law changes
 - A. Non-consensual towing .
 - 1. Prevents towing from private lot without 24 hour notice.
 - 2. Melanie made a bunch of calls yesterday
 - a) Durango is a home rule city which means we can set our own city rules that can conflict with state rules.
 - b) Durango police told Melanie she could call dispatch if someone wants to remove their car mid market.
 - c) Safety issue that could also mess up booth spaces.
 - d) City will also run into this problem with the special events they put on
 - (1) Need new law that overrides state law; fast tracked law maybe takes 2 to 3 weeks.
 - e) Basin towing is also raising costs for the person who calls for the tow (not the person being towed). Person with a vehicle has no repercussions.
 - f) If the board wants to write a letter we should send it to the Community Development Department.
- VI. Value added survey

- A. How do we want to re-define value added?
 - Melanie spoke with Mark Grubis, who runs Durango Artisan Foods a local company that helps local food producers produce their product.
 - a) When we are rewriting rules and regs we need to consider this.
 - b) Different way of thinking about food processing than we have in the past.
 - c) Shelia: Is it truly value added then? Should it be two applications, say if one was also an ag vendor?
 - d) Broader discussion with a lot of the members after collection of survey data
 - (1) Reserve for general meeting this fall
 - e) What does value added mean for our market?
 - f) Big hang up in our region is a lack of processors
 - g) Can the survey be ready before the September 10th market?
 - 2. Do we need to change the by-laws regarding five county region?
 - a) Clarify?
 - b) Needs to be out to membership two weeks before the fall general membership meeting.

 - 2. Also check with Fairgrounds.
